***Annual Education Results Report

Associate Superintendent Tom Hamer provided highlights of Palliser Regional Schools' Annual Education Results Report for 2017-2018 and the Three Year Plan for 2018 to 2021.

The report looks at data supplied by Ab. Education's annual accountability Pillar survey of students, staff and parents and outlines Palliser's plans to address areas of concern. Mr. Hamer told the Board that instead of Central Office telling schools what changes need to be made, the focus will now be offering support to develop the capacity of school leaders to make good decisions for their students. This includes ongoing professional development opportunities for staff, and a greater focus on staff and student wellness as well as enhancing student leadership.

***School Calendar Draft

The Board viewed a draft of the 2019-2020 school calendar. In an effort to customize calendars to best meet the needs of students, parents and staff, Deputy Superintendent Mike Nightingale indicated the draft will now be shared with various stakeholders for their input and possible changes before being brought back to the Board for approval in February.

***Planning Priorities for Capital Projects

Secretary Treasurer Dexter Durfey presented a draft of Palliser's three-year capital plan and its 10 year planning priorities.

He said a solution to school needs in Coaldale remains Palliser's highest priority, with a proposal for a new high school and grade configuration submitted to the province. Following, in order of priority, is County Central High School in Vulcan, the combined needs of students at both Coalhurst High and Coalhurst Elementary schools; and then Sunnyside School.

Mr. Durfey told the Board that plans call for every school in Palliser to be examined similarly over the next few months to further determine future needs.

***Bus Trip to Strathmore

On Wednesday, Nov. 28, the Town of Coaldale councillors invited Palliser representatives to view a new school attached to a recreation centre in the town of Strathmore. The George Freeman School opened in Sept. 2018 (K-8) with 500 students with the recreation centre opening in Jan 2019.

***Grand Re-opening of Noble Central School in Nobleford on Nov. 15, 2018

The modernized 2 storey school cost 8 million dollars and took 2 years to build. The front entrance was enlarged, classroom windows were made larger and sliding glass doors in the lower level allow added space to classrooms when needed. It is a great addition to our Palliser school system, and offers a safe and positive learning experience for students.
