- 4. School Board Report: Sharon Rutledge
 - Grade Configuration & Space Utilization in Coaldale schools.
 - Meeting was held on Tuesday March 27th with Coaldale School principals, senior administration & Coaldale area Board Members to review past

discussions on grade configuration and space utilization in the Coaldale Schools. Further meetings with the Coaldale community will be held before the end of June with no changes implemented before the 2019 -2020 school year.

- Associate Superintendent
 - Mr. Pat Rivard, former associate superintendent, of Palliser Regional Schools has left as of April 16th, 2018 to pursue new challenges and opportunities.
- New Busses
 - 3 new busses have been budgeted for 2017-2018 school year and 3 more will be purchased in the 2018-2019 school year. The 6 new busses will improve the overall age of the fleet. (85 busses. Average age 7-8 years)
 - Self-regulation pilot project (Dorothy Dalgliesh, Jennie Emery, Champion School & Menno Simons Christian School in Calgary)
 - Shane Cranston (Director of Learning) and Karen Braun (Behavior Support Specialist) shared information about self-regulation.
 - Self-reg is a method of understanding and managing stress
 - Shift from trying to enforce compliance of challenging behaviors by teaching kids how to reduce their stress and behavior themselves.
 - 70% of mental health problems have their onset during childhood & adolescence.
 - Young people 15-24 more likely to experience mental illness and or substance use disorders.
 - Policy 16- Safe Caring & Inclusive Learning draft policy will be shared with school admin and the final versions will be posted on the website before June 1, 2018.
