Policy 19: Student Transportation

A standard for busing must be set that supports **schools of choice** for parents and yet ensures that small, rural schools are viable. Administration is recommending the policy be accepted as presented, the **fee schedule** be reviewed and implemented for the **2020-2021 school year**, and **changes to the existing bus routes** be implemented on **January 1, 2020.**

The draft fee schedule will be reviewed by the Board in November. The transportation supervisor David Shaw will make arrangements with the families of existing stops to ensure that they are aware that additional students will be on the bus as of January 1, 2020.

Literacy Annual Report

Director Adam Browning reported that a Literacy Framework has been created to effectively share strategies and techniques. The 2019-20 focus is key areas of oral language including digital literacy. A library /resource centre will be created for staff to share resources and literacy projects. Palliser partnered with Frontier College providing summer reading programs.

Wellness Annual Report

Director Shane Cranston shared Palliser's Wellness Goal. "Palliser students will become literate in mental health, gaining knowledge and understanding in pursuit of living a healthy life".

The Accountability Pillar data shows more work needs to be done in making stronger connections between students and their school. The strategies schools choose will be based on their needs and research. The question for Palliser is how the system can support schools to support students.

Nutrition Program Support

The nutrition grant of \$15.5 million from the Province has been continued. The nutrition program in Palliser schools served about 630 students every day last year, with another 440 students receiving a snack. Some schools offered both breakfast and lunch.

Principals noticed a remarkable difference in students who eat healthy meals with the help of the nutrition program.

Palliser has Family School Liaison Counselors and Family Connections Workers who support students, families, schools and communities.
