# Ms. Pascal-Kindergarten News

Our month has been focused on helping our young learners adjust to the transition of school days. Our class has been learning all about apples, routines, healthy habits and our own names! It has been an exciting month of establishing routines, and expectations while learning songs and learning to socialize with our peers. Our main theme was apples! This theme guided our learning activities and allowed for us to work on growing our understanding of school in a fun manner.

In kindergarten we start our mornings outside in nature. We had many scavenger hunts during our outdoor wellness times and spent time learning to appreciate nature and the different trees that make up our school yard. We are continuing to work on our sensory awareness of nature and how it can benefit our learning. Our class spent our outdoor time doing many activities such as: nature walks, stretches, leaf rubbings, chalk drawings, and morning singing.

This month in our early literacy we focused on name awareness and the letters which make up each of our names! We worked on printing our names, building our names and identifying our names. Each morning students work on learning to print their names with correct upper/lower case letters, as well as building their names out of blocks and various natural objects ( leaves, sticks, pine cones etc.). We have also been working very hard on our poem reading and class singing.

In math we started our sorting unit. We practiced sorting apples and various other manipulatives by color. We will continue to work on sorting while learning how to explain our sorting rules. We have also started our numeracy awareness with rote counting daily and numeral identification exercises.

In social studies we are focusing on our "I am Unique" unit. We have started to look at things that are unique to us and what that means. We have just begun our 'affirmative words' exercises in class. This is a time where students look at themselves in a mirror and have to say something about themselves starting with the phrase "I am...". This is a great opportunity for children to realize we are all different but we all have wonderful attributes.

In line with our apple theme, our class had the opportunity to experience making their own apple sauce from start to finish. We peeled, cut, cored, and mashed the apples into a delicious snack.

In all it has been an extremely busy month in Kindergarten! Keep your eyes peeled on ClassDojo for the upcoming October newsletter to see what is happening in our classroom!







### Mrs. Klassen- Gr. 1/2 News

What a wonderful start to the year we have had in grade 1/2! Each and every day we are building stronger relationships, running hard, playing hard and learning lots. This amazing weather has allowed us to be outside as much as we can, and the kids love it!

**Outdoor Learning-** We spend at least an hour outdoors at the beginning of the day, and often go out again later in the day. This month we continue to explore the changing of seasons, plants and animals, and observe the cycles around us. Our daily walks are an opportunity for students to build friendship, connect to nature, sing songs, and share stories. The mornings are almost always cool, so please remember to dress in layers...thin gloves are a great idea for October mornings. Once the snow flies, please send your child in snow pants and winter gear.

**Reading:** Our book bins are full and we are off on our reading adventures! Whether learning letter sounds or discovering new titles, we are building our reading lives one page at a time. I hope all families can find time to read together for enjoyment... find a comfy spot and read to your child whenever you can!

**Writing:** Our kids have so many stories from their own lives to write about and in October we will continue to work on these beginning writing and printing skills.

**Math:** Patterns are everywhere and we are identifying, extending and making patterns. We are also working on building our number sense all the time in grade 1/2. Later in October your child will be asked to bring in a collection of small items for sorting and counting, such as buttons, coins, etc...I will keep you posted!

We are looking forward to a fantastic October ahead!





## Mrs. Slusar- Gr. 1/2 News

Wow! What a stellar start to the school year! I can hardly believe we have already put in one whole month of school. The students have come to school eager and ready to learn and our weather has been truly amazing!

We begin each morning outside with Land-based Learning, and what a pleasure this has been for us this month. The children have had the opportunity to explore every corner of our school grounds and have identified purple asters, milkweed plants and pods, kochia weed (that turn into fun tumbleweeds), crickets, grasshoppers, abandoned bird nests and the list goes on. We have been reading and learning about the Land Acknowledgement and have had many discussions and stories during First Nations Week.

We are well into our Reading Workshop lessons and spend each day reading from our book bins, doing phonemic awareness, a word work program as well as a new addition of Secret Stories. Please ask your child if they are able to tell you any of the vowel secret stories. It is a fun, story-based program that helps children crack the reading code.

In Math I am using the Jump Math program this year which consists of lessons and activities. The focus for both grades this month has been Number Sense. They have learned a couple of Math games as well: Jack and the Beanstalk (similar to Snakes and Ladders) and the card game War. We will continue to learn many math games throughout the year.

Hi Everyone! I hope this finds you well. I cannot believe that September is over! I guess time really does fly when you are having fun! And, oh, what fun we are having!!!! As we adjust to getting back into routines and schedules, we are having a ton of fun learning. Take a peek at a few of our highlights!!



- → Math: Numbers, numbers, numbers!!! We have been studying numbers by practicing skip counting, place value, standard form, expanded form, number words, etc. Grade 3s must know and work with numbers up to 1000 while Grade 4s will work to 10,000. Along with our daily math lessons, we have been spending a lot of time playing math games. Try challenging your child to a game of "Higher or Lower" or "MVP" (Most Valuable Place)!
- → LA: We are focusing on reading and writing nonfiction or informational text this term. Our focus right now is looking for the main idea and supporting details and writing "How To" paragraphs. In addition, we have word work and a class read aloud of "Katie Kazoo Switcheroo" by Nancy Krulik on the go.
- → Social: We are currently working on a mini mapping unit. Students are learning about the world around us by looking at the continents, oceans and Canada as well as basic mapping skills.
- → Science: Students have been excited to share their rock collections from home as part of our Rocks and Minerals unit.
- → Art: We are exploring the Elements of Art with a focus on the colour wheel right now. Needless to say, each of our projects is filled with amazing colours!!
- → Wellness/PE: Students are spending almost 2 hours every day outside exploring our school yard and activities that make them feel well.

### Mrs. Jesse- Gr 5/6 News

Wow! Where has the month of September gone?! It has been a busy, exciting month getting to know each other and the new "Mrs. Jesse" routines for the 5's! The grade 6's have sure given the grade 5's lots of great advice on how to "succeed" in Mrs. Jesse's class .

In Math, we will be finishing up our first unit on Place Value of both whole and decimal numbers. We will likely have a cumulative review of all lessons just before Thanksgiving. I've encouraged students still struggling with these concepts to practice saying both large and small (decimal) numbers at home. We have also covered rounding and basic addition and subtraction questions.

In LA, we are just finishing up our first units in reading and writing. Both units focused on reading and writing workshop expectations and plenty of practice time. Students are already reading for 25 minutes in class with little difficulty, and have completed three writing assignments (one visual, one poem and one proper paragraph). We will be starting our narrative unit next week.

In Social, we have focused on politics and the election as well as Reconciliation. Students have impressed me with their political knowledge and passion for the topic. I was also blessed to be a part of heartfelt conversations regarding hot topics such as Covid-19, racism and of course Orange Shirt Day. Students demonstrated repeatedly their compassion and respect for these big topics. We are moving onto mapping next week.

In Science, we started the year with many fun engineering challenges to think like scientists, test our ideas, and work as a team. We then dived into our first topic, which is wetlands and students have completed their first research project. We will continue this topic throughout October.

Finally, in art students have completed their first art project and they turned out beautifully. Here is a quick picture of their final project (we are missing a few, but they are almost done and will join the pack).
