## News from Grade 3/4J

One month of school left!!!!! Can you believe it?!? May has been a busy month and so will June. We are busy working on our last few units and have so many things on the go for our recess/wellness time, not to mention the field trips and activity days that we've taken part in. There's never a dull moment here at Sunnyside!!! Here's a few of the highlights from the past month.

Ł Math: Along with our daily "Math Buzz" challenges, we have been looking at time (telling time, units of time, elapsed time, calendars, etc.), perimeter, area, and are starting to explore 2-D and 3-D Shapes.
$\star$ LA: In Reading, we continue to spend time reading independently and to enjoy our class read-aloud of "Charlotte's Web". We continue to practice our reading skills (ex. making connections, developing our vocabulary, summarizing a story, digging deeper into our understanding of the author's message, etc.). In writing, we have been focusing on poetry. We have written 5 Senses, Alphabet Alliteration, Cinquains, Haikus and Autobiographical poems. In word work, we have been focusing on homonyms (ex. their/they're/their, vane/vain/vein, etc.)
$\star$ Science: The fun and experiments continue as we look at building things that move. We have made "walking horses" and toy cars are up next. We have also planted a variety of seeds (sweet peas, radish, nasturtiums, etc.) in preparations for our next unit on Plant Growth and Changes.
$\star$ 3/4J Art: In Art we have been using oil pastels to create some very beautiful flowers (inspired by Georgia O'Keeffe). Take a peek! Aren't the colours amazing?!?!


Extra-curricular activities: - Our field trip to see the Troyanda Ukrainian Dance group present its Grade 3 Social Curriculum show. - Our participation in "Outside for a Day". - Working with the Kindergarten students on some Numeracy skills.

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## Grade 5/6 News- Mrs. Jesse

We made it to June! June is always an exciting, yet emotional month for the $5 \%$ class at Sunnyside. It tends to feel a bit like a rollercoaster!

LA: Students will be finishing up their Fantasy Book Club unit and move into poetry for June. They will have the opportunity to read and write various poems throughout the month. A poetry anthology will complete their year in language arts.

Math: Students will be finishing up the Shape and Space unit, and spend some time learning about Stats and Probability. They will also spend time practicing their problem solving skills, which will include all basic operations and review concepts from earlier units.

## Spartans Football Program

The Spartans Football Program represents the Town of Coaldale in the Southern Alberta Minor Football Association. Our players range from 8-14 and compete at Atom, Peewee and Bantam levels. The Spartans football program provides a positive outlet for the energetic youth in our community. Under the direction of Football Alberta, all coaches are required to have a valid Criminal Record Check and to have completed the Safe Contact Course.
Atom (8-10) is where players begin to learn the game of football. Player safety is of the utmost importance and this element, along with understanding the rules and fundamentals of the game. Our coaches focus on teaching blocking, safe tackling, passing catching and running.
Peewee (11-12) is full contact football. Modified rules are introduced to maximize player safety while still focusing on developing skills to take to the next level.
Bantam (13-14) is for players who are not yet registered in high school, but not yet in Grade 10.
Bantam
is the last level in minor football before sending players to High School Football.
Team Fees is $\$ 85$ and are due at the first regular season practice that begins at the end of August. This fee is separate from the registration fee paid to the Lethbridge Minor Football Association. Each player must provide their own football cleats, mouth guard and water bottle.
