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

research project and learning about the sun and moon.



May Newsletter - Grade 6

Well that two week break in April sure made the month fly by. I hope everyone had a lovely and well deserved break with family and friends. May and June will be very busy months here at Sunnyside, so I am sure they will fly by quickly as well.

Math: We are just starting our Motion Geometry unit, where students are challenged to transform shapes on a grid. They will be working with various shapes and will be translating, reflecting and rotating shapes in all directions. Students are also working on mastering long division with decimals and are doing very well overall. We will be moving onto our Measurement unit mid-May.

LA: Students will finish their non-fiction unit in reading and writing with a celebration of their non-fiction text. Students will be sharing their books with various classmates, and hopefully their reading buddies. Books can be accessed at home for sharing with parents as well. Students will also start their poetry unit this month, with a primary focus on imagery and figurative language. Students will practice reciting poems in preparation for our Poetry Celebration day at the end of May. During the writing portion of our class we will spend the majority of May preparing for the grade 6 PAT on May 28th. Students will review the elements of a story in order to write a narrative. We will also review the components of an essay in preparation for the non-fiction portion of the exam.

Social: We just finished our Historical Models of Democracy unit and our study of the Iroquois Confederacy. We have now moved into looking at the rights and responsibilities of Canadian citizens laid out in the constitution and the Charter of Rights and Freedoms. We will follow this unit up with a comparison of Local and Provincial government and will hopefully head to City Hall for a tour with the Mayor of Lethbridge.

Science: Students have started their space unit. We have been learning about our Solar System and each student has been researching one of our planets or dwarf planets. We will also be looking at the various technologies used to explore space.
