

June 2025 Newsletter Principal's Message

As the last month of school approaches, we are starting to put together a plan for next school year already - which is hard to believe! There are a number of things that I want to put on your radar as next year approaches.

As I mentioned in an email earlier this week, our staffing is being reduced because of budget cuts. I don't want to get into all the details here, but we are losing a half-time teacher and some support staff hours. The result of losing the half-time teacher is we will no longer have a specific music teacher next year. We are trying to fill these gaps as best as we can and I hope that it doesn't affect our students and staff too much. Thanks to those who have reached out to ask questions and offer support.

As you recall, our report cards and interviews looked a little differently this year - we limited our written report card comments and had additional face-to-face opportunities to chat about your child's progress. The survey that I sent out about a month ago had a number of preferences from parents - most parents liked the extra interview dates (or were happy either way) and also shared that they would prefer a 20 minute slot instead of a 15 minute slot. So, we are going to try to accommodate that for next year by having interviews on Thursdays and Fridays (during the day). You can see the extra dates that have been set aside for conferences on next year's calendar (which is on our website and was emailed out to you).

I wanted to say a huge thank you to you, the parents, and to Mrs. Klassen. We had an amazing "Poetry and Popsicles" event last week. I am always impressed by the level of support from parents - it really does make the event! Thank you for helping your child memorize their poem and for showing up to watch them. Without parents coming, it wouldn't have the same cache for the students. Also, thanks to Mrs. Klassen for planning the event and getting things ready to go. This is the 2nd straight year we have done this event, and I think it's going to be a keeper for the next few years!

Please make sure you take a peek at the calendar for June - we have a number of field trips, fun events, graduations, and (for grade 6's) Provincial Achievement Tests. There are many events that couldn't happen without the dedication of our staff and all of our amazing volunteers. From hot lunches to trips to Pavan Park, mini-basketball to badminton, and fundraisers to attending assemblies - our students are so lucky to have so many amazing adults in our corner. Thank you, parents and staff, for all that you do for our students!

Lastly, for those of you wondering about grade configurations for next year, we usually make our class lists in August. I also don't honor requests for students to be in certain classes, as there are often too many variables - but I'm more than happy to chat about what might be best for your child!



We made it to June! June is always an exciting, yet emotional month for the grade 6 class and teacher at Sunnyside. It tends to feel a bit like a rollercoaster!

LA: Students are continuing their poetry unit into June. They will have the opportunity to read and write various poems throughout the month. We are focusing on identifying and using figurative language in their novels and in their writing. Students will also be prepping for their PAT on June 17th.

Math: Students have finished up their Measurement unit, and will spend some time learning about Statistics and Probability. They will also spend time practicing their problem solving skills, which will include all basic operations and review concepts from earlier units in preparation for PATs on June 17th and 18th.

Science: Students are working through their final unit in Science: Earth Systems. We will hopefully have this unit wrapped up with a little time to review. Students will write their final on June 13th.

Social: Students are currently learning about the democratic systems of local and provincial governments. We are heading to City Hall on June 4th. Then they will work on reviewing for their year end final. They are working on reviewing the concepts of Democracy for their PAT on June 19th.
