The Palliser Numeracy Professional Learning Community is a dedicated group of teachers and administrators who support continued growth of math teaching and learning. Teachers are focusing on aligning instruction, supporting students who require additional help particularly in Grades K-3 where foundational skills are critical for long term success.

Palliser continues to prioritize strong Literacy Foundations, especially in the early years. This year, more than 1,000 students from K-Gr.3 received support in reading and language development. While progress has been made in creating more consistent assessment practices, changes to provincial literacy assessments have introduced some challenges.

The Palliser School Facilities Team has experienced significant changes this year. The unexpected passing of long-time Facilities Supervisor Rod Swatzenberger was deeply felt by all who knew him. Rod oversaw the planning, construction and completion of the Coaldale Prairie Winds Secondary.

The team is now led by Rick Aos, Facilities Manager, and supported by Stephen O'Connor, Maintenance Supervisor who oversees Palliser's caretaking staff. The Board reviewed progress on the strategy to strengthen Inclusive Education by implementing a new Individual Program Plan (IPP) which is more efficient and offers staff to meet a wide range of student needs with more engaged family involvement. The Board received an update on Indigenous Education. Students enrolled in the division tend to achieve higher results on provincial tests and literacy assessments. Trends in high school completion, fewer drop-out students and transition to post-secondary education is continuing to strengthen in a positive direction. The Division's Financial Update shows a positive shift, with the projected deficit for 2024-2025 from \$1.36 million to approximately \$1.09 million. Additional funding

supporting dual credit programming, enrollment growth and subsidized fuel costs, have helped to offset some key expenses.

Palliser's Three-Year Education Plan will discontinue the use of "Our School" surveys as they overlap Alberta Education surveys. Instead, schools will develop local surveys to gain more meaningful information.

4) Principal's Report (Mitchell Van Dyk)

We are busy gearing up for the final 6 weeks of the school year! It's going to be busy, but there are a lot of great things happening!

- 1) I have draft calendars for everyone to take a guick look at before I finalize them.
- 2) We also had some really good feedback on our report card survey. Basically, the majority of people had this to say:
